### FIRST AID

### HAVE LABEL WITH YOU WHEN OBTAINING TREATMENT ADVICE IF SWALLOWED:

- Call a poison control center, doctor, or 1-877-854-2494, or 1-800-858-7378\*\* immediately for treatment advice.
- . Have person sip a glass of water if able to swallow.
- Do not induce vomiting unless told to do so by the poison control center or doctor.
- Do not give anything by mouth to an unconscious person.

#### IF ON SKIN OR CLOTHING:

 Take off contaminated clothing. Rinse skin immediately with plenty of water for 15–20 minutes. Call a poison control center or doctor for treatment advice.

### IF IN EYES:

- Hold eye open and rinse slowly and gently with water for 15–20 minutes.
- Remove contact lenses, if present, after the first 5 minutes, then continue rinsing eye.
- Call a poison control center or doctor for treatment advice.

### NOTE TO PHYSICIAN

If swallowed or absorbed through the skin, this material may reduce the clotting ability of the blood and cause bleeding. If Ingested, administer Villamin K<sub>1</sub> intramuscularly or orally. Repeat as necessary based on monitoring of prothrombin times.

#### TREATMENT FOR PET POISONING

If animal eats bait, call veterinarian at once.

### NOTE TO VETERINARIAN

Anticoagulant Bromadiolone: For animals ingesting bait and/or showing poisoning signs (bleeding or elevated prothrombin times), give Vitamin K<sub>1</sub>. If needed, check prothrombin times every 3 days until values return to normal (up to 30 days). In severe cases, blood transfusions may he needed

### DIRECTIONS FOR USE

It is a violation of Federal law to use this product in a manner inconsistent with its labeling. **READ THIS LABEL:** Read this entire label and follow all use directions and use precautions. Use only for sites, pests and application methods described on this label.

**IMPORTANT:** Do not expose children, pets, or nontarget animals to rodenticides. To help to prevent accidents:

- Store unused product out of reach of children and pets.
- 2. Apply bait in locations out of reach of children, pets, domestic animals and nontarget wildlife, or in tamper-resistant bait stations. These stations must be resistant to destruction by dogs and by children under six years of age, and must be used in a manner that prevents such children from reaching into bait compartments and obtaining bait. If bait can be shaken from bait stations when they are lifted, units must be secured or otherwise immobilized. Stronger bait stations are needed in areas open to hoofed livestock, raccoons, bears, or other potentially destructive animals, or in areas open to yandalism.

USE RESTRICTIONS: This product may only be used to control the following rodent pests in and around man-made structures: House mouse (Mus musculus), Norway rat (Rattus norvegicus), Roof rat (Rattus rattus), Cotton rat' (Sigmodon hispidus), Eastern harvest mouse' (Reithrodontomys humuli), Golden mouse' (Ochrotomys nuttali), Polynesian rat' (Rattus exulans), Meadow vole' (Microtus pennsylvanicus), White-throated woodrat' (Neotoma albigula), Southern plains woodrat' (Neotoma micropus), and Mexican woodrat' (Neotoma mexicana). This product must be used in and within 100 feet of man-made structures constructed in a manner so as to be vulnerable to commensal rodent invasions and/or to harboring or attracting rodent infestations. Examples of such structures include homes and other permanent or temporary residences, food processing facilities, industrial and commercial buildings, trans protrepting, trans, aircraft), docks and port or terminal buildings and related structures around and associated with these sites. Fence and perimeter baiting, beyond 100 feet from a structure as defined above, is prohibited. This product must not be applied directly to food or feed crops.

DIRECTIONS FOR USE (Continued from other panel)

This product may only be applied to active burrows to control rats within 100 feet of buildings and man-made structures constructed in a manner so as to be vulnerable to commensal rodent invasions and/or to harboring or attracting rodent infestations provided that infestations of these rodents have been confirmed. Efforts should be made to remove food trash, garbage, clutter and debris. Bait must be placed no less than 6 inches into active rat burrows. Do not broadcast bait.

Do not place near or inside ventilation duct openings. Do not contaminate water, food, feedstuffs, food or feed handling equipment, or milk or meat handling equipment or surfaces that come into direct contact with food. When used in USDA inspected facilities, this product must be applied in tamper-resistant bait stations. Do not use this product in sewers.

Do not sell this product in individual containers holding less than 16 pounds of bait.

SELECTION OF TREATMENT AREAS: Determine areas where rats, mice or meadow voles\* will most likely find and consume the bait. Generally, these areas are along walls, by gnawed openings, in or beside burrows, in corners and concealed places, between floors and walls, or in locations where rodents or their signs have been seen. Protect bait from rain and snow. Remove as much alternative food as possible.

### APPLICATION DIRECTIONS:

RATS: Apply 3 to 16 ounces of bait at intervals of 15 to 30 feet per placement. Maintain an uninterrupted supply of fresh bait for at least 10 days or until signs of rat activity cease.

MICE AND MEADOW VOLES\*: Apply 1/4 to 1/2 oz. (1–2 level tablespoons) of bait per placement at 8 to 12 foot intervals. Larger placements (up to 2 oz.) may be needed at points of very high activity. Maintain an uninterrupted supply of fresh bait for at least 15 days or until signs of mouse or meadow vole\* activity cease.

FOLLOW-UP: Replace contaminated or spoiled bait immediately. Wearing gloves, collect and dispose of all dead, exposed animals and leftover bait. To prevent reinfestation, limit sources of rodent food, water, and harborage as much as possible. If reinfestation does occur, repeat treatment. Where a continuous source of infestation is present, establish permanent bait stations and replenish as needed.



# PRECAUTIONARY STATEMENTS HAZARDS TO HUMANS AND DOMESTIC ANIMALS

CAUTION: Harmful if swallowed or absorbed through skin. Causes moderate eye irritation. Do not get in eyes, on skin, or on clothing. Keep away from children, domestic animals, and pets. All handlers (including applicators) must wear long sleeved shirt and long pants, shoes plus socks, and waterproof gloves. Any person who retrieves carcasses or unused bait following application of this product must wear gloves.

### User Safety Requirements

Follow manufacturer's instructions for cleaning/maintaining PPE. If no such instructions for washables exist, use detergent and hot water. Keep and wash PPE separately from other laundry. Remove PPE immediately after handling this product. Wash the outside of gloves before removing. As soon as possible, wash hands thoroughly after applying bait and before eating, drinking, chewing gum, using tobacco or using the tollet and change into clean clothing.

### **ENVIRONMENTAL HAZARDS**

This product is extremely toxic to fish, birds and other wildlife. Dogs, cats, and predatory and scavenging mammals and birds might be poisoned if they feed upon animals that have eaten this bait. Do not apply this product directly to water or to areas where surface water is present or to intertidal areas below the mean high water mark.

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
